Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2019-20 educational progress for Covert High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-22 year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has a least one underperforming student subgroup in 2018-2019. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2017-18. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2016-2017. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Covert High School has not been given one of these labels.

In order to meet the needs of our students, we are addressing learning deficiencies of high school students that have been identified based on their NWEA scores. This year the high school created a 20-minute class called Successful Learning. This class allows teachers to focus on Social Emotional Learning (SEL) with students utilizing the TRAILS program. Students have also taken responsibility for grades and missing assignments. PLC time has been dedicated to learning about the Essential Instructional Practices for Disciplinary Literacy. Monthly data review meetings allow staff to collaborate, monitor student progress, and adjust instructional strategies.

Student Assignment to Schools

Covert Public Schools assigns students to schools based on their current grade level. Covert Elementary serves students in grades Pre-Kindergarten to fifth grade. Students in grades sixth through eighth are enrolled at Covert Middle School. Covert High School serves students in grades ninth- twelfth. Students in eleventh grade have the opportunity to enroll at the Technology Center at the Van Buren Intermediate School District.

School Improvement Status

The staff at Covert High School collaborates to create the improvement plan to focus on the needs of ALL students. Goals are created in different subject areas with a focus on reading achievement. During the school year, the plan is monitored regularly to view progress on each goal. The goals are analyzed to ensure that our strategies and activities are benefiting students based on the data. Adjustments are made to the goals when necessary to raise student achievement.

Specialized Schools

The Van Buren Intermediate School District provides all eleventh graders with career development and technical training. A broad range of specific programs are offered in the following areas: Art and Communication, Business Management, Marketing and Technology, Engineering/Manufacturing and Industrial Technology, Health Services and Natural Resources and Agriscience. Each program offers career skills, job seeking skills, related education skills and some college credit.

Core Curriculum

Covert High School has developed a core curriculum as mandated by the State of Michigan. Teachers have received training in common core instruction and have created safety net standards for reading and math. Outcomes to be achieved by all students have been defined based upon Common Core State Standards.

Parent teacher conferences are held twice annually providing opportunities to communicate student progress each semester. Due to COVID our conferences were held face to face or through Google Meet. The high school parent participation was 20% for fall conferences. Spring conferences take place in February.

Advanced Credit Options

19% of the 10th through 12th grade students have the opportunity to enroll in college classes. Students currently are enrolled in 6 different courses for the middle college.
