

# THINK- TAC- TOE SUMMER BOOK REPORT

Select three mini-projects to complete for your Summer Reading Project on your SSYRA Selected Book. You will choose projects that create a tic-tac-toe (3 projects that form a straight line either vertically, horizontally, or diagonally). This project will be due on August 24<sup>th</sup>. <p>Make an information cube about your book. Make sure the cube is colorful. Include the following information on the six different sides of the cube:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Title      Characters      Setting</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Plot      Favorite Part      Illustration of a Scene</p>	<p>Compare and Contrast yourself to the main character using a Venn Diagram. Include six to eight items in each section of the Venn Diagram. You must use more than appearance to compare and contrast.</p>	<p>Write a different ending to your book. This should change what happened in the final chapter. Your new ending must be a page long, typed, double spaced, and in a font that is no larger than 14 points.</p>
<p>Pretend you are interviewing a character from the book. Write the interview in question and answer format. Write the answers as you think the character would answer them. You must include a minimum of ten questions with answers.</p>	<p>Design a poster advertising your book. Include interesting details about the book that would make others want to read it. The poster needs to be colorful and include pictures along with written words.</p>	<p>Create a new book jacket. Fold a piece of construction paper in half. Draw a picture on the cover. The picture should represent an important scene in the book. It must be different from the actual cover of the book. On the back cover, write a summary of the book in your own words. The summary should be two paragraphs in length. Each paragraph should be at least five sentences long.</p>
<p>On a piece of paper, you need to identify one example of either simile, metaphor, or personification from your novel. These are common figurative language devices that authors use. You need to give the example, tell why the author is using that piece of figurative language, and tell what two things are being compared.</p>	<p>Pretend you are the main character in your book. Write a diary for a few days or weeks as the character in the book. Make sure you include specific details from the story. You need to have six entries. Each entry needs to be at least four sentences.</p>	<p>Write a letter to the author. In the letter include parts of the book that you liked, parts that you didn't like, and a change that you would make to the book. The letter should be at least three paragraphs in length and each paragraph should be at least five sentences in length.</p>
