Accountability – Detail Data and Status

The accountability portion of the AER includes assessment proficiency and participation rates, graduation or attendance rates, as well as accountability index values showing school performance on a 0-100 scale.

Teacher Qualification Data

- Identifies the number and percentage of inexperienced teachers, principals, and other school leaders. Reports teachers who are teaching with emergency or provisional credentials
- Includes teachers who are not teaching in the subject or field for which they are certified

NAEP Data (National Assessment of Educational Progress)

- Provides state results of the national assessment in mathematics and reading every other year in grades 4 and 8

A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Bothwell Middle School	TSI	Special education math support classes, special education reading classes, math intervention classes for general education students, and reading support classes for general education students

Cherry Creek Elementary School	No Label	Targeted support in a small group setting, a multi-tiered response to intervention and a strong staff data dialogue
Graveraet Elementary School	No Label	Closing the achievement gap, improving student attendance, social-emotional well-being
Sandy Knoll Elementary School	No Label	Data review, targeted small group reading and math teams, iPad or Chromebook technology
Superior Hills Elementary School	No Label	Social emotional learning class for all students
